



A LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

After the last two years of adapting to the circumstances around the COVID-19 pandemic with hybrid and virtual programs, we returned to primarily in person programming in 2022. We made some amazing accommodations and adaptations during the pandemic which allowed us to continue to serve our community, but there is really no substitute for hands-on experiential environmental education. It was such a pleasure for our educators and volunteers to be engaging again, directly with the public at our programs. Busing was still an issue for schools in 2022, so for several K-12 field trips, we brought the estuaries into the classrooms with our estuary curriculum kits. We also returned in person, in the field for many of our K-12 field trips including Estuary Life and Landforms and On the Water which both served 100% more students than in any previous year. In total, we served over 4,500 K-12 youth in 2022.

As a compliment to the success of our K-12 programs in 2022, our all-ages programs flourished as well. Nearly every Pier Peer event sold out! This prompted us to plan for even more monthly Pier Peer events in 2023 to accommodate the demand for the program. Additionally, we experienced the highest levels of community participation yet, at our walking tours and Tiny Tides Story Time programs. We had more Estuarium visitors than we have experienced in any previous year and we interacted with over 7,000 community members, tabling at local and regional events! Our ever-growing volunteer team helped us reach these milestones, as 100 new volunteers joined in 2022, and our volunteers put in over 2,800 hours to provide estuary education to our community through outreach, programs, Estuarium visits, and assistance with planning K-12 field trips. While we relished our ability to engage with the public in person, we also continued to grow our online presence, providing online education experiences like our virtual Discovery Speaker Series. In 2022 we reached a total of 19,486 people through in person education programs and events and an additional 59,877 people through online programming, for a total combined community reach of 79.363.

In summary, through collaboration with our community partners, the tireless work of our amazing staff, our volunteer Board and the 140 Estuarium volunteers who clocked hours in 2022, we were able to expand our community reach by over 100% in 2022. In 2021 we reached 37,627 which was a milestone for the Estuarium. In 2022 we reached 79,363 people in the south Sound and beyond with our mission of providing educational experiences and encouraging stewardship of the estuaries of the south Sound and the greater Salish Sea. 2022 was such a banner year at the Estuarium and it would never have been possible without the generous support of our community of individual donors, foundation grantors, government grantors and corporate donors. 
